Our mission is to assist youth and families in making healthy decisions, to reduce youth substance use, and to ensure the future of a safe and healthy community.

We work toward this by encouraging collaboration, expanding programs and services for youth, and by supporting sustainable change

Outcomes: Policy

- Danvers Police Department Policy on Enforcement of Underage Drinking Incidents and Compliance Checks (2006)
- School Chemical Health Policy strengthened (2008)
- Drug Take Back Program at Danvers Police Department (2009)
- DHS Tobacco Policy (2009)
- Public Consumption of Alcohol/Public Use of Marijuana Policy (2010)
- Revised Liquor License Guideline-(2011)
- Zoning of medical marijuana facilities (2012)
- BOH Tobacco Policy-zoning, permitting, and minimum legal sale age increase to 21 (2014)

Outcomes: Practice

- Compliance Checks Sustained by PD
 - Liquor Law Compliance remains over 90%
- Community Recognition Pledge Program
- Drug and Sharps Disposal Continued
- School-Based Universal Substance Use Screening
- Law Enforcement Jail Diversion practice: crisis intervention and referral for people needing Mental Health and Substance Use treatment
- All first responders trained and carry Nasal Narcan
- School Nurses carry Narcan

Outcomes Program

- YMCA Youth Night Programming-15 events, twice annually, over 750 students
- Student Leadership-over 500 involved in leadership program
- Community Service-over x opportunities for youth to engage in community in the past 9 years

Outcomes: Partnerships

- Youth programming at the Library

- Annual business sponsorships for opiate awareness walk
- Funds raised for student scholarships
- Funding for Parent University
- Growth of Coalition participation: youth and organizations
- Workforce Investment Board: Youth Summer Jobs
- Danvers Rec Department and NS Community College service learning/afterschool program enhancement
- Internship placement site for NSCC
- Businesses supporting our ParentsCARE campaign
- SAPC and MOPAC partnerships, e.g. Project Adventure

Outcomes: Health Impact (2010 to 2016)

- Percent of students drinking and driving decreased from 26% to 17.5%
- Current high school alcohol use decreased from 46% to 35%.
- Current marijuana use decreased from 30% to 24.5%
- Current cigarette use decreased from 17% to 8%.
- Heavy (binge drinking) decreased from 31% to 21%.
- First use of alcohol before age 13 decreased from 18% to 10%.
